Filming the Dusky Dolphin

A study testing new underwater cameras has given scientists the best view yet of the lives of wild dusky dolphins. A research team managed to attach small, high-tech cameras to a full range of dolphins, from young ones to adults. They hoped that filming them would provide greater understanding of the dolphins and their ecosystem, and help develop conservation efforts. However, the cameras also captured other activities which are rarely seen, such as mothers looking after their babies and other dolphins rubbing their flippers together as if they were shaking hands.

The Australian team initially considered running the research project off South America, but decided instead to go somewhere with calmer waters. Just off the coast of New Zealand, the scientists went out with their equipment and tempted the dolphins with food. The method used to attach the cameras wasn't very scientific. As the dolphins swam by the boat, the team quickly and harmlessly fixed them on by means of a long pole, on which there were cameras with suction cups. These stuck to the animal's skin. Although it was a simple method, it wasn't an easy one, as the dolphins are small and very fast, so the researchers had to aim accurately.

From the surface, researchers can see only 10% of what is going on in a dolphin's life. The new waterproof cameras send the underwater film to the crew, who, in total, gathered over 500 hours of film. The cameras are designed to fall off when the battery becomes exhausted, which is after about six hours. They are very tough, and even dolphins bumping into rocks or coral does not dislodge or damage them. This makes the cameras nearly twice as effective as older designs, which only had three hours of memory.

The team are now preparing to attach cameras to as many dolphins as possible in water with high levels of human disturbance. They are concerned that shipping and coastal development are affecting the animals' ability to feed and raise young. They are confident that the new cameras will reveal how effectively a variety of dolphin species deal with their challenges. They eventually want to move on to researching sharks and are also planning an extensive whale research project some time in the future.

A. The mayor of the Turkish town of Karamursel is being hailed as a hero after jumping into the sea to rescue two boys who were in difficulties. Mayor Ismail Yildirim was attending an event on the beach when he saw the teenagers in the water calling for help. The mayor took off his shirt and made his way to the boys to the applause of onlookers.

B. The skipper of a racing yacht has described the moment a 'huge wave' tore off its mast and left the crew stranded in the Atlantic Ocean for nearly two days. Fourteen sailors were rescued by the crew of a Royal Navy warship after the 60-foot Clyde Challenger yacht was damaged in stormy conditions. It was returning to the UK from a four-and-a-half month trip.

D. A paraglider was pulled up to safety in a dramatic rescue yesterday afternoon. Despite perfect weather conditions, he turned in error, crashing into a cliff face. The stranded man was left hanging from a steep cliff on the North Cornwall coastline. A passing man realised the paraglider was in trouble when his dog barked at him, and alerted the authorities. Coastguards, lifeguards and a helicopter were called to the scene.
